J.M. Huxley's first book, award-winning *MILK AND HONEY LAND: A Story of Grief, Grace, and Goats* is a story that begins in childhood with a PSA 727 crash into the heart of a young girl's hometown and feelings it was a harbinger of things to come. With the loss of her father in a commercial airline crash a decade later, persistent dreams at night of planes falling out of the sky seem to brush irony across the heavens but don't keep her from flying regularly when she takes a position as a San Diego traffic reporter. The death of two colleagues in a work-related disaster, and other losses, fuel a quest for supernatural understanding. Truth, she will learn, requires the loss of everything that keeps her from it.

Huxley's second book is a book of hope for children, entitled *RAINBOW LAND*. Captivating illustrations combine with poetic verse to spark a child's understanding of the colorful world around us and the God who created it. Based on the award-winning book *Milk and Honey Land: A Story of Grief, Grace, and Goats*, *Rainbow Land* encourages children to fully experience the Great Painter's masterpieces and to recognize the great love still found in rainbows.
